


## THE CLEANERS JAMBIANI

This inspiring project involve 3 men - Abdallah, Abu, Musa and 1 woman - Hidaya. They clean the 7-km long beach and village of Jambiani every day after the first low tide. They receive support from several hotels in the area, which provide rubbish collection points and financial assistance. The initiative also involves MUMA, a waste management company that collects garbage from the hotels and the beach cleaners. This successful collaboration not only promotes sustainable waste management practices, but also helps to keep the area clean. Over the course of six years, this initiative has been very successfully and gathered thousands m<sup>3</sup> of plastics.

As part of this initiative, he constructed many trash bins in the village. His activity got many followers, including hotels, tourists, locals and youth.



**Our team of waste managers and tailors use thousands of cement bags, Tetra Pak cartons, fishing ropes, surfing kites and some of the hard plastics, turning this recycled waste into all sorts of awesome products, that now can be found in popular retail stores, hotels, school and community. The project is self-sustaining and does not rely on donations, as its products meet high demand.**



A private waste management company that efficiently deals with all kinds of waste generated by private and industrial/commercial sectors. The company's trucks collect waste from hotels every two days and from residential properties once a week, transporting it to a designated site in the vicinity of Stone Town, where rubbish goes through a second thorough differentiation. Furthermore MUMA distributes the recyclable plastic materials to various private enterprises that manufacture attractive upcycled products.



The project was officially launched in 2018 as a pilot project for OZTI East Africa to find a sustainable way of recycling hard plastic in Zanzibar. They take active part in different Environmental, Education and Empowerment projects. Besides, they revive plastic waste into amazing useful products, such as cool decor items and souvenirs.
